

GUIDELINES FOR EULOGIES

Through a persons' life, the story of their trials, achievements, high and low points, labours and loves are seldom, if ever told.

The Eulogy is a way of telling a story so loved ones and friends can share the different aspects of that persons' life and character.

We hope the following will be of assistance and allow a family member or friend who you may ask, to write the Eulogy.

Some points you may wish to include:-

- Where and when was the person born?
- Who were the parents of your loved one?
- Did they have any brothers and sisters?
- Where did this person go to school?
- Some amusing experiences they had when growing up?
- Was this person in the Defence Forces?
- Where and when did this person meet and marry their partner?
- Any children, grandchildren and their names?
- Did they belong to any association or club?
- Did your loved one have any hobbies or interests?
- Is there a poem or verse you may like to include in the service?
